

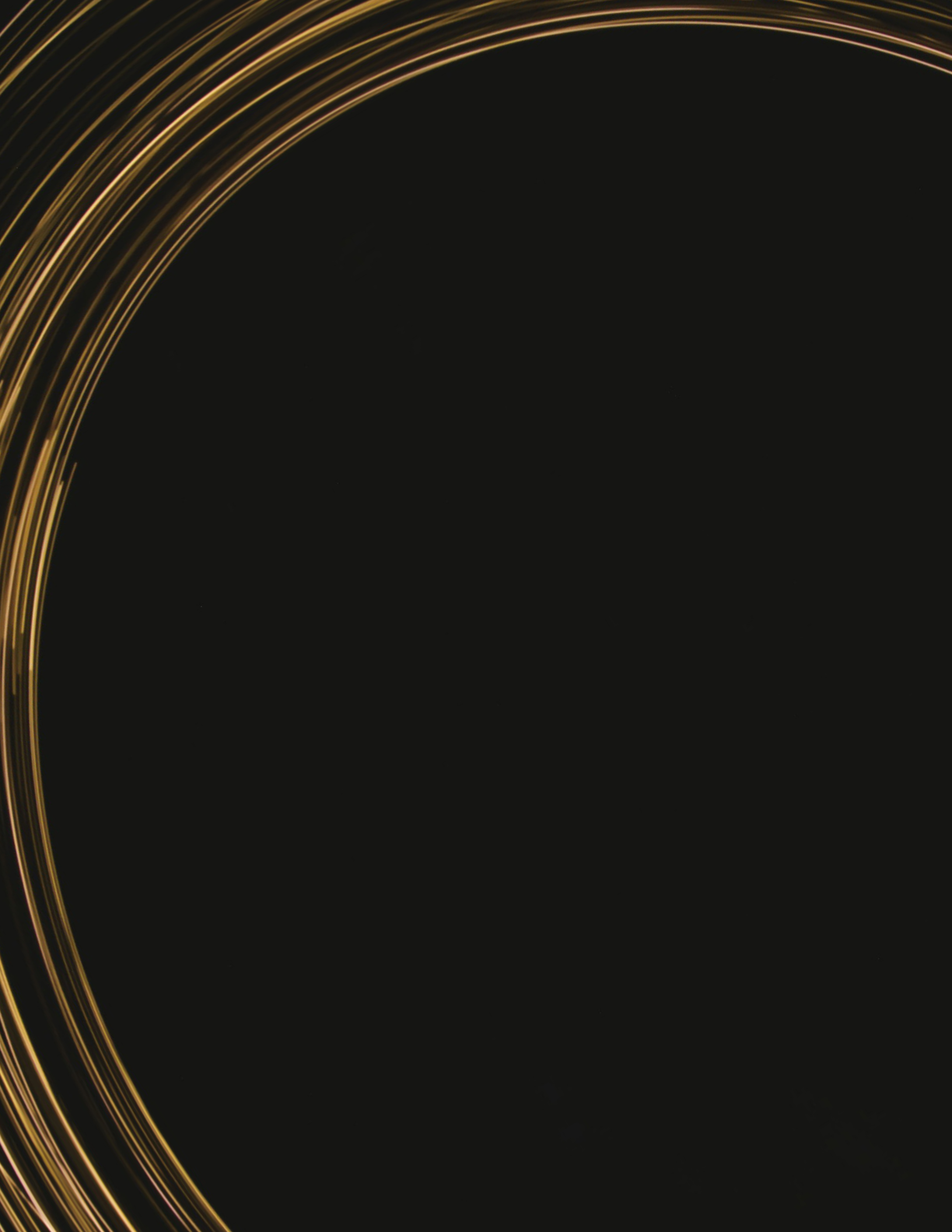

For the Hébert family, philanthropy is a family affair. Three generations of Héberts have been actively involved in Centraide of Greater Montreal. For Norman Hébert Jr., a former chair of the Major Donors' Circle, the Centraide connection is as natural as it is important: "My father was a Major Donor too. He came from a very modest background and, early in his career, he wanted to give something back. He realized that giving to Centraide was a very efficient way to support a wide range of agencies. We knew our donations would go a long way."

But the Héberts aren't just interested in philanthropic efficiency. They want to help build a fairer, more peaceful society. "Centraide directly contributes to preserving social peace," says Norman Hébert Jr. "When we support the most vulnerable people, it gives them hope and a chance to bounce back. In a big city like Montreal, that safety net is crucial."

His son, Norman John Hébert, witnessed his father's commitment from a very young age: "I accompanied my father on visits to agencies. Those small teams led by creative, dedicated people were bringing about incredible change in their communities. Seeing it first-hand showed me the tangible impact of giving. I realized that Centraide had the ability to identify and support these quiet changemakers who are so essential to our social fabric."

The direct contact with the agencies was a turning point for Norman John. He has picked up the family torch and is now involved not only as a Major Donor but also in a number of active roles; he chairs the

employee campaign at Groupe Park Avenue and volunteers on Centraide of Greater Montreal's Workplace Campaigns' Cabinet and Major Donors' Cabinet. "Today, I'm in a position to do more. I want to develop my own network and engage my own generation. We need to think about the next generation: Major Donors had a huge impact in my father's time, but we must prepare for the future."

Both men believe in passing on their values by setting an example. From childhood, Norman John and his sister were exposed to the social realities of their city and also to the power of action. "We served meals, we visited agencies. We understood very early on that giving back does good—for yourself and for others," he says.

Mobilizing the next generation

How can a new generation be inspired to become Major Donors? "We have to make them want to get involved, show them that other people like them are doing it too," says Norman John. "This is a generation that wants to contribute but also to be part of the conversation. Centraide has everything to gain by reaching out to them."

A sentiment his father fully shares: "Being a donor is a personal choice. But when you've been successful in life, you also have a responsibility to help build a stronger society. We must do our part and inspire others to do the same."

A committed journey for her city.

“I love Montreal deeply.”

That sentence sums up the passion that has driven Marie-Josée Neveu for more than 30 years. She is a woman

with strong convictions and a big heart who has always been motivated by the desire to make a real and lasting impact on her community.

Marie-Josée has a long and wide-ranging record of philanthropy and volunteering, getting involved wherever she feels she can make a real difference for Montrealers. She has served on the boards of Hôpital Maisonneuve-Rosemont, YWCA Montreal, Tourisme Montréal and Parc Jean-Drapeau, to name a few. “Those are all very different roles, but what they have in common is the opportunity to improve people’s well-being,” she says.

So joining the board of directors of Centraide of Greater Montreal, an organization she describes as a unique social catalyst, in 2018 was an obvious choice for her: “There is no other organization in Montreal with the same combination of credibility, social expertise and strong ties to all community stakeholders—corporate, community-based and governmental.”

During her seven years on the board, including six as chair of the governance committee and the last as vice-chair of the board, she was instrumental in overhauling Centraide’s governance. The size of the Board was reduced to encourage discussions and optimize governance; governance policies were improved; and DEI principles were strengthened on the board, in its practices and in the recruitment of

directors. “A good board of directors inspires trust,” says Marie-Josée. “And trust is what enables Centraide to continue raising more than \$60 million a year, year after year.”

Her commitment started a long time ago. It is a deep-rooted value, almost an instinct, inherited from her father, who was also very involved in the community: “It’s natural for me. I’ve always felt the need to give back and I’ve always felt most useful when I’m doing something.”

Housing is a recurring thread among the causes that are particularly close to her heart. “When you think about the essentials of life, having a roof over your head is pretty basic. And yet, in every big city I’ve visited since the pandemic, it has become a major issue. We need to address it collectively.”

With her major donation, Marie-Josée Neveu is reaffirming her dedication to the causes she cares about. She demonstrates how financial support coupled with time, conviction and a readiness to listen can effect lasting change in our community.

Giving where it counts.

When Sam reflects on the roots of his philanthropic commitment, he starts with his mother. Scarred by the war, she arrived in Montreal from Greece with nothing. But she carried a deep sense of duty to help people in need. “Up to the age of 94, she always told us: You have to give to those who don’t have,” he recalls. “She didn’t just say it, she did it. For herself, she bought second-hand, but she gave generously to those in need.”

Sam and his brother grew up with this value etched in their hearts. Giving became second nature: “We’ve always given as much as we could.” Today, they have the means. And they’ve chosen to do more, together.

They’ve also passed this commitment on to the next generation. For the Erimos family, the owners of Supermarché PA Montreal, philanthropy is a family affair, decided and lived collectively.

Every year, the eight members of the immediate family get together to choose the causes they want to support. “We started 30 years ago with a small local agency,” explains Sam. “Since then, we’ve listened and tried to respond to requests. Our donations budget grows every year. That’s the way we like it.”

A commitment rooted in the community

After searching for an organization they could fully trust, the Erimos family chose Centraide. “We wanted to be sure that our donation would really help the community, not fund unwieldy structures,” explains Sam’s niece Joanna.

In Centraide, they found a partner that matched their values: transparent, well-managed, rooted in the community and capable of supporting a wide range of causes. “Centraide funds agencies that address essential issues such as education, food security, housing—everything that matters to us,” says Joanna. “And the money stays here, in Greater Montreal.” For the Erimos family, that was important: before giving elsewhere, they wanted to make sure their neighbours could live with dignity.

Sam sees the situation today as critical: “The needs are exploding. We hear horror stories about families who can no longer feed their children because of the rising cost of living. It’s awful to think about kids going to school without breakfast. Children are innocent; they’re paying the price for a situation they have no control over.”

With humility and conviction, the Erimos family continues to increase its impact, year after year. “We have to support our community,” says Sam. “It’s something I believe in strongly.”

Supporting our social safety net.

Nicolas Marcoux vividly remembers the day philanthropy became part of his life. It wasn't at a gala or fundraiser but in a hospital delivery room, on a night of anxiety mixed with hope. There were complications during the birth of his second son, and Nicolas silently raised his eyes to heaven and spoke to his friend Michel, who had recently died of cancer: "If there's anything you can do to help us, I promise to give back."

His son was born healthy. He is now a doctor and an athlete. And true to his word, Nicolas started giving back a few days later. "It had to be a big cheque," he recalls. "It had to mean something."

A few years later, there was another turning point: a speech by David McAusland, an engaged Montrealer. In a talk to PwC partners, he reminded them that they were privileged to live in a city like Montreal, which is safe and humane thanks to an invisible but vital social safety net.

The message hit home. Nicolas increased his donation and then became increasingly involved. Today, he has been active with Centraide for over 20 years. He has been a Major Donor since 2012 and remains as committed as ever. "We need role models. David was one for me."

Nicolas knows he's one of the lucky ones. He sees

what's happening in the city. "The needs have exploded over the past 20 years. But the resources aren't keeping pace. We have to close the gap."

When time is short, trust is crucial

With his busy professional life, Nicolas Marcoux has neither the time nor the resources to research all the causes that appeal for his attention. "There are a multitude of needs and priorities, and I can't analyze them all myself. That's where Centraide comes in." He trusts Centraide's expertise to focus on the most pressing issues, channel donations effectively and maximize their impact. "Centraide knows what's needed, pools the resources of all donors and acts where it matters most."

As CEO of PwC Canada, Nicolas is now based in Toronto, but he remains attached to Montreal. He supports both communities with equal enthusiasm through United Way and Centraide.

What if true wealth lies in giving back?

Guillaume Bazinet didn't grow up in either poverty or luxury. But on the South Shore of Montreal where he was born, he witnessed both. He saw disadvantaged neighbourhoods and affluent ones. "I come from the middle class," he says. "My father was a high school teacher and my mother worked at a CLSC as a training program coordinator. I soon realized that people aren't all born with the same opportunities. It's not true that anyone can achieve anything with enough determination. Some are born into favourable circumstances and others are not. I think those who are privileged should give something back."

Guillaume was also deeply affected by his partner Suzie Lalancette's story. She had a more difficult childhood. Raised by a single mother, an orderly who died of cancer at the age of 47, Suzie experienced social injustice first-hand. Compassion for others is part of their family life and at the heart of their philanthropic commitment.

Acting on that impulse, Guillaume started making occasional donations to causes that touched him. Then, in 2023, a watershed event occurred: he sold his company to Bell Canada. His life changed and he wanted to do more and do it differently. He decided to structure his giving by creating a family foundation.

"I wanted philanthropy to be part of our life plan," he says. "I wanted my children to understand how lucky they are and to discover the joy of giving." He involved

them in decision-making, took them to events, and passed on to them the sense of social responsibility that he considers so important. "With great power comes great responsibility. Our money must be used to do good."

In 2024, he was asked to get involved in Centraide of Greater Montreal's annual fundraising campaign. That experience catalyzed him as he discovered the scope of the organization's work. "Centraide is like a large-scale ripple effect," he says. "By giving to one organization, you can support dozens and dozens of agencies that are changing lives. It's a way to make sure the main issues are addressed across the various neighbourhoods of Greater Montreal. I'm very interested in local impact, so for me it was an obvious choice."

Today, Guillaume firmly believes that philanthropy isn't just for the wealthy. "We can all make a difference," he says. "It could be a donation equal to the price of a cup of coffee per week or a few hours of volunteering. My wife Suzie volunteers at a palliative care home every week. For us, it's a concrete way of living our values and walking the talk. The important thing is to start. Giving does good—for yourself and for society as a whole. If everyone does a little bit, together we can build a stronger and more just community."

W

hen Karel Velan founded his company in Montreal after escaping Communist Czechoslovakia in the

aftermath of World War II, he brought with him more than engineering expertise—he carried a profound belief in helping others. He arrived in Canada with very little, but as the business grew, so did his desire to give back.

“My grandfather always believed that success should be shared,” says Rob Velan. “It wasn’t just about building a company—it was about building community.” That mindset would lead to the creation of the Velan Foundation in 1980, ensuring that future generations of the family would remain deeply committed to philanthropy.

In 2025, the company celebrates two major milestones: the 75th anniversary of Velan Inc. and the 20th edition of its Centraide campaign. Throughout the years, the company and its employees have remained loyal to Centraide of Greater Montreal, a commitment rooted in values of compassion, responsibility, and solidarity.

“Centraide is the most effective way we know to support our community,” explains the businessman. “It ensures that funds are directed to where the needs are greatest. It tackles pressing issues and strengthens the fabric of our city by empowering the people and agencies working on the ground.”

For the Velan team, the choice to support Centraide is both strategic and emotional. In a world where challenges are increasingly complex and social divides more visible, they believe in the power of collective action. “Centraide brings people together to create lasting change,” continues Mr Velan. “It’s about more than charity—it’s about shared values. It’s about building a more compassionate and united future.”

From one generation to the next, the Velan family continues to honour Karel’s legacy—by building not just a company, but a better world.
